Founded in 1970, Douglas College is the largest degree-granting college in British Columbia, Canada, educating close to 24,000 students per year.

The College has two major campuses in Metro Vancouver (New Westminster and Coquitlam) as well as several smaller training centres and the Anvil Tower.

Douglas College's student body is characterized by great diversity, with over 4,000 international students from 92 countries. Most Douglas College students are enrolled in Bachelor programs or will eventually transfer to a local University to continue their studies.

Students must:

- be nominated by their home institution.
- maintain the equivalent of a 2.5 grade-point-average (GPA)
- demonstrate proficiency in English
 - TOEFL 83
 - IELTS 6.5
 - CEFR C1
 - or signed approval from your home institution
- be able to obtain, or be exempt from needing, a student visa

Date and Deadlines

Fall 2021 semester (September to December)

- Application deadline: April 30th, 2021
- Orientation: the week before classes start
- Classes: Sept. 8, 2021 Dec. 6, 2021
- Exams: Dec. 9, 2021 Dec. 16, 2021

Winter 2022 semester (January to April)

- Application deadline: September 15, 2021
- Orientation: last week before classes start
- Classes: Jan. 4, 2022 April 12, 2022
- Exams: April 14, 2022-April 22, 2022

Summer 2022 semester (May to August)

- Application deadline: January 31, 2021
- Orientation: last week before classes start
- Classes: May 4, 2022 August 5, 2022
- Exams: Aug. 7, 2022 Aug. 16, 2022

Visas

Exchange students coming for <u>6 months or less</u> do not need to obtain a Study Permit.

However, students will need to obtain an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) or a Visitor (Temporary Resident) Visa, depending on their nationality.




